It is difficult to date these, as there was always a big time-lag between the discovery and its practical application. But it is clear that the beginning of arithmetic, algebra and geometry were laid in the earliest period. Ten formed the basis of enumeration in India even at the time of Rig Veda. The time and number sense of the ancient Indians was extraordinary. They had a long series of number names for very high numerals.
